

Fustos and Horosz Report No. 2 24 December 2014

Research Highlights

GOAL

Extend the ancestry of [Private] through the Fustos and Horosz lines.

PROGRESS

- The unknown mother of Helen Margaret Horosz was identified.
- Three of the four sets of great-grandparents of [Private] were identified.
- Towns of origin in Hungary/Slovakia were found for the Fustos and Horosz families.
- Other Fustos and Horosz individuals were found in the United States, but no connections could be made to the client's family lines.
- Marriage records were requested from Allegheny County, Pennsylvania for Andrew Fustos and Esther Banyacsky, and Stephen Horosz and Mary Busky/Rusky. When they are received, we will forward them to the client.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Look for any connections to the Fustos and Horosz families with the names found on passenger lists as travelling companions and/or destinations for Andras Fustos and Istvan (Stephen) Horosz.
- 2. Time was not spent during this period on the Banyacsky or Busky/Rusky lines. These families should be researched during the next session.
- 3. Once the requested marriage records are received, it is hoped that the parents of Andrew Fustos will be identified and the Fustos line can be extended in Vel'ké Raškovce, Michalovce, Slovakia. The Horosz line is ready to be researched in Novosad, Trebišov, Slovakia. Microfilmed church records are available at the Family History Library for both locations.

Research Report

The objective for this research session was to extend the ancestry of [Private] through the Fustos and Horosz lines.

Andrew Fustos, Jr. and Helen Horosz

The client provided the information that [Private] was the daughter of Andrew Fustos, Jr. and Helen Margaret Horosz. Andrew Fustos, Jr. was born 8 March 1919 in McKeesport, Allegheny, Pennsylvania and died October 2006 in West Mifflin, Pittsburgh, Allegheny, Pennsylvania. He married Helen Horosz on 24 August 1946 in Pittsburgh, Allegheny, Pennsylvania. His parents were Andrew Fustos, Sr., who was born about 1889 in Hungary and died June 1976 in McKeesport, and Esther Banasky, born about 1894 in Hungary and died January 1961 in McKeesport. With all of this information, research began.

The death date for Andrew Fustos, Jr. was verified in the *Social Security Death Index* as 17 October 2006 in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, and his birth date was given as 8 March 1919, also agreeing with the family records.¹ Andrew's enlistment record for the United States Army in World War II was found, showing that he enlisted on 1 October 1942 at Pittsburgh, Allegheny, Pennsylvania.² Following World War II, Andrew applied for veteran's compensation and was paid \$500 for his domestic and foreign service during the war:³

The application for a marriage license for Andrew Fustos, Jr. and Helen Horosz signed on 14 August 1947 gave the following information:⁴


Andrew Fustos, Jr., Bricklayer, born McKeesport, PA, residence 2331 5th Ave. McKeesport, PA, date of birth March 8th 1919, age of 28 years, no previous marriage; father Andrew Fustos, Sr., mother Esther Banyacski, same residence, father's occupation Steel Worker, parents born Hungary, physically able to support a family.

Helen Horosz, Candy Packer, born Homestead, PA, residence 1212 Margaret St. Munhall, PA, born March 15th 1923, age of 24 years, no previous marriage; father Steven Horosz, mother Mary Rusky, both parents deceased, both parents born Hungary.

Application signed 9 August 1947, license issued 14 August 1947.

The marriage return was included with the application, showing that Andrew and Helen were married on 24 August 1947 at the Hungarian Reformed Church in Munhall, Allegheny, Pennsylvania by Rev. Julius Paal. This record confirmed the names of Andrew's parents and the father of Helen Horosz, and gave us the name of her mother as Mary Rusky.

Ancestry.com has recently released a database containing death certificates for the state of Pennsylvania for the years 1906-1963. Pennsylvania law restricts public access to the records of births for 105 years and the records of deaths for 50 years. Esther B. Fustos' 11 January 1961 death certificate was found in this collection. As expected, she died in McKeesport:⁵

This record lists her birth date as 27 April 1895 in Hungary, and her parents as Andrew Banyacsky [sic] and Susan Tarr, both born in Hungary. Family information stated that Andrew Fustos died in June 1976, meaning that his death certificate is not available to us at this time.

The databases of marriages in Pennsylvania at Ancestry.com and FamilySearch.org were searched for the marriage of Andrew Fustos and Esther Banyacski/Banyacksy, but no record was found. A copy of the marriage record has been requested from Allegheny County, Pennsylvania and it will be forwarded to the client as soon as it is received.

Andrew Fustos, Sr. registered for the draft in World War II on 27 April 1942.⁶ His birth date was given as 16 August 1889 in Hungary. He and Esther were living at 2331 Fifth Avenue in McKeesport, and Andrew worked for National Tube.

The 1940 Census found Andrew, Esther, and Andrew, Jr. living at 2012 Sylvan Avenue in McKeesport (see photo below).⁷ They rented their home for \$18.00 per month. Also in the household were their daughter Elizabeth, her husband Frank, and their son Frank, Jr.

The Fustos family indicated that they were living in the same house in 1935, while the Bakos family was living in the same *place* but not the same house – meaning that they lived in McKeesport in 1935, but not at this address. Andrew was listed as a naturalized citizen who was working at the Tube Works; Andrew, Jr. worked as a truck driver for a furniture store; Frank worked as a salesman for a baking company; and Elizabeth worked as a seamstress in a clothing factory. In 1930 the family was living at 529½ Evans Avenue in McKeesport, renting for \$16.00 per month.⁸ This home appears to have been located where the current McKeesport hospital is, and was likely torn down when the hospital was built. Andrew was working as what looks like a "tonnage" in the steel mill, but no definition could be found for that particular occupation. He stated that he immigrated to the United States in 1907 and was naturalized by 1930. Esther stated that she immigrated in 1913. Andrew gave his place of birth as Czechoslovakia, and Esther gave hers as Hungary:

Finding the family in the 1920 Census was extremely difficult, but a good match was finally found on Cherry Alley in McKeesport.⁹ The enumerator's pen seemed to have run out of ink in the middle of the family's entry. It is impossible to read the original surname as written, but the name has been written over as "Smoken." However, the members of the family and their ages appear to be Andrew (listed as Andy) and Esther Fustos and their children, Andy and Elizabeth. The years of immigration have also been written over and are not correct, and the names of the three boarders are not legible:

Andy [sic] Fustos registered for the World War I draft on 5 June 1917.¹⁰ His birth was again given as 16 August 1889, but this time he gave the full place of his birth as Nagy Raska, Hungary. His address was 1254 Jerome Street in McKeesport and he was employed at the "Gas House" of the Tube Works Company. At the time he registered for the draft, he was still a citizen of Hungary, which means he was not a naturalized U.S. citizen yet. On this record he is described as being 6' 1" tall, slim, with brown hair and brown eyes. He was married and had one child under age 12, (which would be Elizabeth, according to census records). He signed his name as "Andy Fustos":

Only one possible match was found for Andrew Fustos in the 1910 Census – a boarder living in McKeesport who worked as a laborer in the Tube Mill.¹¹ He was 21 years of age, born in Hungary, and stated that he arrived in the United States in 1907.

We were able to locate naturalization papers for Andy Fustos, and they gave the following information:¹²

Certificate of Arrival: Andras Fustos, arrived at Ellis Island in New York, 10 March 1907, ship *Brandenburg*.

Declaration of Intention: Andy Fustos, aged 34 years, Mill Worker, born in Nagyraska, Czechoslovakia, 16 August 1889, residence 528½ Evans Avenue, McKeesport; emigrated to the U.S. from Bremen, Germany on the vessel


Brandenburg; wife Esther, born in Czechslovakia; arrived at New York about 10 March 1907; signed 16 November 1924.

Petition for Naturalization: Andy Fustos [same information as Declaration of Intent]. Wife Ester [sic] born 28 April 1894 in Czechoslovakia; daughter Elizabeth born 2 July 1916 in McKeesport, Pennsylvania; son Andrew born 8 March 1919 in McKeesport, Pennsylvania; signed 26 April 1927.

Oath of Allegiance and citizenship granted 16 September 1927.

Rootsweb.ancestry.com provided the following description and photo of the S.S.

Brandenburg:¹³



The S.S. Brandenburg was built in 1902. It had a capacity for 60 second-class passengers and 1,660 third-class passengers. First and Second class passengers were called "ladies and gentlemen". Steerage passengers were jammed together much like cargo down below.

The naturalization papers state that Andy arrived in New York on 10 March 1907 and had lived in Pennsylvania since 11 March 1907, indicating that he did not remain in New York but went straight to Pennsylvania - probably to McKeesport. This means that he probably

had a friend or relative at his final destination. Indexes to ship passenger lists at Ancestry.com and EllisIsland.org failed to show Andras/Andy Fustos, but a line by line search of the passenger list for the *S.S. Brandenburg* arriving on 10 March 1907 finally revealed four men travelling from Nagyraska, Hungary, with their final destination listed as McKeesport, Pennsylvania.¹⁴ This list included Andras Fustos. All four men were farm laborers; could read and write; were subjects of Hungary; had their race listed as Magyar (Hungarian rather than Slovak); last permanent residence was Nagyraska; final destination was McKeesport, Pennsylvania; they were in good health; and they were born in Nagyraska:

Andras Menyhert, age 46, married, purchased his own ticket, \$6 in his possession, was in the U.S. previously in 1901 in McKeesport, going to his acquaintance Johann Kacso(?) at 328 4th Street in McKeesport, 5'4", fair complexion, brown hair, blue eyes.

Andras Fustos, age 17, single, ticket purchased by father, \$10 in his possession, never in the U.S. previously, going to his cousin Mike Svorgo(?) at 422 Locus Street in McKeesport, 5'6", fair complexion, black hair, brown eyes.

Istvan Fustos, (father –written faintly), age 40, married, Non-immigrant Alien, purchased his own ticket, \$10 in his possession, was in the U.S. previously in 1893 in McKeesport, going to his cousin Mike Svorgo(?) at 422 Locus Street in McKeesport, 5'9", fair complexion, brown hair, brown eyes.

Janos Gyurka, age 27, married, purchased his own ticket, \$10 in his possession, never in the U.S. previously, going to his brother Andras Gyurka a 328 4th Street in McKeesport, 5'5", fair complexion, brown hair, brown eyes.

The notation for Istvan Fustos, "Non-immigrant Alien," means that he was not planning to stay in the United States and that this immigration record could not be used to apply for naturalization at a later date. The record implies that Istvan was the father of Andras Fustos, and the name of a possible cousin in McKeesport is given. These are important clues

for continuing the research on the Fustos line. There may also be family connections to Andras Menyhart and Janos Gyurka.

It is also interesting to note that Andras/Andy Fustos was listed as being only 5' 6" tall on this record, at age 17, but then when he registered for the WWI Draft ten years later he was 6' 1". Either he experienced a huge growth spurt in his late-teens/early-20s (which is fairly unusual), or one of these records is mistaken about his height.

Nagyráska was a village in Zemplén County in Hungary. It is now called Vel'ké Raškovce, and is located in the Slovak Republic. (After World War I, parts of Hungary were ceded to Czechoslovakia, which was later divided into two nations, the Czech Republic and the Republic of Slovakia.)

The Family History Library has microfilmed church records for Vel'ké Raškovce for the years 1752-1863. If the marriage record that has been requested from Pennsylvania for Andrew Fustos and Esther Banyacsky identifies Andrew's parents, it may be possible to locate them in these microfilmed records. Even if it doesn't, it may be possible to locate them based on the potential name of Andrew's father from the passenger list – Istvan Fustos.

Time was not sufficient during this session to search for the Banyacsky/Banyacski family. This should be done in the next research period.

Stephen Horosz and Mary Rusky or Busky

Family information stated that Helen Horosz's mother died when Helen was an infant, and that she was then sent back to Czechoslovakia to be raised by her grandmother. Her mother's name was not known. The marriage record for Andrew Fustos, Jr. and Helen Horosz (discussed earlier in this report) gave her mother's name as Mary Rusky. In the *Pennsylvania Death Certificates* collection on Ancestry.com, we were able to find a death certificate for Mary Horosz, who died on 9 November 1923 in Allegheny County Hospital in Woodville, Pennsylvania of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and Cardiac Asthenia.¹⁵ Her daughter Helen would have been just 7 ½ months old at that time. Mary's birth date was given as 2 October 1894 in Hungary (she was just 29 years old when she died), and her parents were John Busky [sic] and Mary Kovach, both born in Hungary:

The databases of marriages in Pennsylvania at Ancestry.com and FamilySearch.org were searched for the marriage of Stephen Horosz and Mary Busky or Rusky, but no record was

found. A copy of the marriage record has been requested from Allegheny County, Pennsylvania and will be forwarded to the client as soon as it is received.

Death certificates were also found for Stephen Horosz and his second wife, Anna Salance. Stephen Horosz died 30 April 1942 in Munhall, Allegheny, Pennsylvania.¹⁶ His age was given as "about 54 years" and his birthplace was Czechoslovakia. His parents were given as Michael Horosz and Susie Kovac, both born in Czechoslovakia. The informant was his son, William Horosz:

Anna Horosz died 24 May 1940 in Homestead, Allegheny, Pennsylvania.¹⁷ Her date of birth was 28 November 1891 in Slovakia, and her parents were Joseph Salance and Anna Baran, both born in Slovakia. The informant was her husband, Steve Horosz [sic].

The census records for 1920, 1930 and 1940 were searched extensively, but no record could be found for Stephen Horosz. Family information stated that Helen Horosz had a brother named William Frank Horosz. He was found in the *Social Security Death Index* (SSDI), which gave his birth date as 20 November 1921 and his death as 20 November 2007.¹⁸ William's burial was found at Findagrave.com, which included a copy of his obituary, giving the name of his wife as Ethel I. Bolcshazy and one son, William F. Horosz, Jr.¹⁹

Steve Horosz registered for the World War II draft on 27 April 1942.²⁰ His birth date was 25 September 1888 in Austria-Hungary, and his home address was 819 11th Avenue in Munhall.

The naturalization papers for Stephen Horosz were found, which provided the following information:²¹

Certificate of Arrival: Stepan Hursa [sic], arrived at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 21 April 1912, ship *Prinz Adalbert.*

Declaration of Intention: Stephen Horosz, aged 35 years, Laborer, born in Bodzas Ujlak, Czechoslovakia, 25 September 1888, residence 824 10th Avenue, Munhall; immigrated to the U.S. from Hamburg on the vessel *Prince Albert* [sic]; wife Mary, born in Czechslovakia, now deceased; arrived at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania about 6 April 1912; signed 20 June 1924.


Petition for Naturalization: Stephen Horosz, 824 Tenth Avenue, Munhall, occupation Rigger, born 25 September 1888 at Bodzas Ujlak, Czechoslovakia, immigrated to the U.S. from Hamburg, Germany about 10 April 1912, arrived at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 21 April 1912 on the vessel *Prinz Adalbert;* Widower, son William born 20 November 1922 in Homestead, Pennsylvania; daughter Helen born 20 March 1924 in Homestead, Pennsylvania; signed 8 June 1927.

Oath of Allegiance and citizenship granted 13 November 1927.

The birth dates for Stephen's children are slightly different than the dates found in other records.

The following photo of the *S.S. Prinz Adalbert* was found on a personal blog which referenced old Pennsvylania newspapers, and the description comes from Wikipedia:²²

S.S. Prinz Adalbert was a German ocean liner of the Hamburg America Line...launched on 21 August 1902. In 1912, the Prinz Adalbert was one of several ships to sight the iceberg suspected of sinking RMS Titanic. On the declaration of war in August 1914, she was captured at Falmouth, Cornwall, by Britain...and was renamed Princetown in 1916. She was transferred to France in 1917 and renamed Alesia. On 6 September 1917 she was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine.

Stephen was found on the Hamburg Passenger Lists listed as Istwan Horosz, departing on 6 April 1912 on the *S.S. Prinz Adalbert*.²³ It is interesting to note that this was only one week before the *Titanic* sank. Stephen Horosz was actually on his voyage from Hamburg to Philadelphia at the time of that fateful event. The website TitanicInquiry.org provided the following information about that particular voyage of the *S.S. Prinz Adalbert*:²⁴

Westbound, Hamburg to Philadelphia. On Tuesday, April 16, sighted ice at 3:30 a.m., 42.03N, 48.57W. At daybreak saw a huge field of ice containing many large

bergs, extending in a horseshoe shape from north to south as far as the eye could see.

The vessel altered her course to the south around 8 a.m., seeking a way through the ice. At 8:40 a.m. a suitable spot was found and the ship proceeded slowly through the ice field from 8:45 to 9:55 a.m., and gained open water at 10 a.m., and took up her true course, S85°W, at 41.37N., 50.14W.'

During the transit of the ice field, the chief steward took a photograph of an iceberg that showed a scar of red paint along its base, as though it had been in recent collision with a ship.

The arrival passenger list shows Stephen as "Istvan Horosz" arriving 21 April 1912 at Philadelphia:²⁵


It includes the following information:

Istvan Horosz, age 24, married, laborer, able to read and write, subject of Hungary, race Slovak. Last permanent residence: Bodzasnjkak; Relative left behind: Marya Horosz; Destination: Duquesne (Allegheny, Pennsylvania); passage paid by himself, \$11 in his possession, was in the U.S. in 1904 in Duquesne, going to friend Janos Ruskai (address illegible) in Duquesne, 5'6", fair complexion, brown hair, brown eyes, born in Bodzasnjkak, Hungary.

The passenger list indicates that Istvan/Stephen was married at the time he came to the United States. It is not clear whether the wife he left in Hungary was Mary Busky/Rusky or whether he remarried in this country. If a marriage record is found in Allegheny County as requested, at least this question will be answered.

Bodzás-Nagy-Ujlak (or Bodzás-Ujlak), Zemplén, Hungary is now called Novosad, Slovakia, and is just under 10 miles from Vel'ké Raškovce, which was the town of origin of the Fustos family. Microfilmed church records are available for this location at the Family History Library for the years 1768-1907 which should make continued research on this line successful.

Conclusion

It is quite possible that the Fustos and Horosz families knew each other before their emigration from Hungary to America. There are still a few avenues of research in United States records that should be examined, particularly the possible connections to the other names mentioned in the passenger lists. Once the requested marriage records have been received it will be possible to determine the most efficient way to continue research on these families. With the specific locations known in Hungary, it should be feasible to extend the families back in time at least one generation and possibly more.
